## OFFERS BLOCK FOR CITY PARK

Williston Man will Sell Land for Small Sum to be Used For This Purpose.

Williston, N. D., Aug. 28.—Opportunity to secure another park site has been offered the city by Charles Schumaker, who will sell an entire block near his home in the southwestern portion of the city for the sum of \$200, provided the city will take it over and agree to use it for park purposes. Mr. Schumaker's proposition was placed before the city commission.

## LARGEST BARN IN THIS STATE

Farmer Near Bisbee is Owner of Huge Structure—Is 110 Feet Long.

Devils Lake, N. D., Aug. 28.—J. Halliday has just completed for Hon. C. P. Peterson, who resides on his farm of 1,780 acres one mile south of Bisbee, the largest barn in the whole state of North Dakota. It is 110 feet long, 14 foot posts on the outside. The rafters are exactly 80 feet long. The height from the peak of the roof to the ground is 40 feet, from the top-most point of the tower 65 feet.
