Sentiment in Germany Weakening On War, Declares Teuton Writer

Common People Do Not Understand Why the Fighting Still Goes on—Suffering Dims Eyes to Facts.

London, Sept. 13.—Herr Friedrich Naumann publishes in the current number (August 17) of his weekly paper, Die Hilfe, an extraordinary article on the weakening of German popular opinion about the war and the need to counteract the present tendency. The article is interesting and illustrating German ideas of war propaganda, but still more interesting for the admissions which it contains.

"When the war began everybody was convinced that now we must fight; for how could we let other peoples tear us to pieces? At that time everybody understood that this was a case of necessity, just as if we were threatened by a flood or a fire. But today there are people enough who no longer rightly know why we are still fighting. There really are these people."

"I was visited lately by a soldier who late in the war was taken up in the Landsturm, and who not as a grown man, has passed through his time of training in barracks. I know him well, and I know that by very reason of his calling he understands the way of thinking of the simple people. He said to me: 'It must be explained to the people quite simply and intelligibly why they are still fighting, because they do not know.' I answered that two years ago are surely not so thick-headed. He, however, replied: 'Two years ago all these people knew; but as they read the newspapers only irregularly, have little knowledge of geography and have no training in historical thought, they even at the beginning, grasped the general impression rather than the detailed facts. Meanwhile, all that has for them returned to a state of flux and become obscure, and now they are mentally helpless in face of the sacrifice of the long war. Hence it becomes possible for the agitation of the Liebknecht type to find its way into the very army.'

"Effect of Two Years Suffering." "It has been made further inquiries among men and women who, by constant contact, know something of the way of thinking of small people, and a long time for the memory, especially when people's sufferings and experiences have been so manifold during this time. At the beginning people had no real idea what war is, but they were ready to conduct war. Meanwhile death in the field and privations at home have become greater than any power of imagination had previously conceived. Hence the impression easily arises that one has been pushed into something which one did not really desire. The necessity of what is happening is questioned, and the longing that the abnormal state of things may cease dims the eyes to the inevitable character of events. To this is then added the old

"It has, indeed, been somewhat difficult all along to make plain to the average citizen with little education in history and geography what the real nature of our defense is. The existing land frontiers as though they were an eternal law, and even though his wish is to be very radical, he pins himself to the most conservative maintenance of these accidental frontiers. He utterly fails to grasp that on this side or that side of these historical frontiers there is something that one can describe as national territory or military frontier. Consequently one must give special explanations on this point; and one ought not to let the truth prevail in these frontier conversations merely because of the harmful exaggerations.
