The freshmen registration is expected to exceed that of any previous year. All day Monday and again today the throngs of students thronged the corridors of Merrifield hall in an endeavor to procure their credentials for admission to the University. More than 225 freshmen had sent in their high school credits to the registrar prior to their arrival here and according to Mr. Greenleaf the majority of the first year men applying for admission this year brought their credits with them.


WOMEN WILL MEET WEDNESDAY NIGHT
