TWO YOUTHS ARE ARRESTED

Charged With Giving Liquor and Cigarettes to a Minor.

The police of East Grand Forks arrested two young men today on charges of giving liquor and cigarettes to a minor. The warrant was sworn out by Albert Sanders, the father of the minor.

It is claimed that many young men have been violating the law in this respect, and it is hoped by the authorities that this case will be an example. Chief Albert Hurst secured the men this morning, and locked them up in jail.

On account of the extreme youth of the young men, the Chief refused to divulge their names. They were brought before Justice of the Peace Robert Blair and will be allowed their freedom when they furnish \$300 bonds. It is said this will be done before night. Trial is set for Friday morning, October 6th, at 10 o'clock.

It was said this afternoon the case will attract considerable interest because of the prominence of the two boys. Their parents were in town this afternoon and have made some arrangements for the trial.

FIREMAN INJURED IN GETTING OFF ENGINE

Ed. Bird, fireman on the Northern Pacific, was injured while on his run this week. He was getting off from his engine near Pembina and slipped from the step falling on his face. His cheek was cut and his face so badly injured, he was taken to Pembina where medical attention was secured.

Mr. Bird was brought to East Grand Forks, and is now laid up with a badly swollen face.


