## VILLA BANDITS TAKEN IN FIGHT EXECUTED

Four Men Captured Last Week are Shot—Rebel Deserter Reports That Leader Needs Supplies.

Chihuahua City, Mex., Oct. 29, via El Paso Junction, Oct. 30.—The four Villa bandits who were captured at the Babicora ranch 75 miles southeast of Casas Grandes, Wednesday morning, following a fight between the bandits and the Carranza forces stationed at the Babicora ranch have been summarily executed, an official report received by Gen. Trevino stated. The men who were executed included Major Juan Marrazo, who was in command of the bandits; Captain Perfecto Lopez, second in command and Privates Estevan Cruze and Rafael
