AGGIE TEAM IS CRIPPLED SAYS FARGO REPORT

Line-up Given Out by Coach Davis Shows Several Important Changes.

Hayes May not Go in at Full Back—Movold Stationed at Quarter.

Fargo, N. D., Nov. 3.—When the North Dakota Aggies face the University of North Dakota football team at Grand Forks Saturday for the state football championship, they will present a greatly changed lineup, made necessary by injuries to players.

The Aggies go to Grand Forks aboard the special train that will leave this city at 9:30 o'clock on Saturday morning, and which will carry several hundred A. C. rooters.

Today, a big rally was held at the college, and no little enthusiasm was engendered.

The Aggies go against the varsity team without the services of Hayes, at fullback, injuries keeping him out of the game. While Coach Davis today announced that Hayes would start, indications are that Hanson will be sent to that post.

Another shift in the lineup is made at right guard and left tackle, Captain Bjornson going to the tackle position, from guard, while Huey, former tackle, goes to guard.

The Aggies this year present an unusually heavy line, the average weight of the men being in excess of 183 pounds. For the most part, the experienced players are on the line, the back field, outside of Quarterback Movold, being made up entirely of green men.

Coach Davis announced the following as his probable lineup: Underwood, re; Peterson, rt; Huey, rg; Nemzek, c; Ross, lg; Bjornson, lt; Hauser, le; Movold, qb; Baker, rh; Hayes or Hanson, rb; Kelley, lb.
