Present State Lead Gives Hughes a Lead of 439 Votes.

Returns from all but one of the 79 precincts in Folk county show Wilson to have a lead of nearly 100 votes. The figures are: Wilson, 3,434; Hughes, 2,451. The precinct question has about 20 votes, which will not be received until the canvassing board meets Monday.

Mrs. Robinson states that she receives many communications of commiseration upon her varying existence, which she asserts is exceedingly trying. Her letter states: "The whole country abounds in game, large and small. The streams are full of fish, and the hills are covered with dense growth of wild berries, wild vegetables and beautiful flowers. Churches are plentiful. The scenery is the most magnificent in the world. Its resources, which include the precious metals, coal and minerals of all kinds, have scarcely been touched."

Long Branch, N. J., Nov. 8.—Regardless of the outcome of the election, President Wilson plans to leave here late tomorrow for Williamstown, Mass., where he will attend the christening of Friday of the younger child of Mrs. Francis B. Sayre, his daughter. From Williamstown he will go to Washington, arriving there Sunday night. His plans for the interim between then and the opening of congress in December have not been made.
