THE MARKET WORLD

BIG SLUMP IN WHEAT MARKET

Trading Panicky Throughout Session—Close Lower Than Monday.

Minneapolis, Nov. 28.—The wheat market has been a panicky affair, and a big slump was registered. Minneapolis December wheat closed \$1.77, which is 6 1/2 cents lower than yesterday. During the early trading, the May future sold up to \$1.87 7/8 and afterwards slumped to \$1.80 with the close \$1.81 1/8 to \$1.80 3/4. There was a report that an American ship had been sunk by a submarine and it was also reported that several submarines were headed this way.
