## NO EMBARGO ON STOCK IN STATE

Secretary of Sanitary Board Wires Federal Officers For Advice.

Bismarck, N. D., Nov. 30.—North Dakota has not yet joined in the embargo against the importation of live stock from districts supposed to be affected by the hoof and mouth disease.

Dr. R. H. Tracy, district director for the United States bureau of animal husbandry, and Dr. W. F. Crewe, secretary of the North Dakota live stock sanitary board, are closely watching the situation, and they are prepared to act immediately if it shall be deemed necessary.

Specifications Have All Been Mailed Out

Bismarck, N. D., Nov. 30.—The state board of regents has finished mailing out its specifications for boarding house supplies for the ensuing three months and for other supplies for six months to come. These are to be filled out by all of the institutions and will be made a basis for bids upon which contracts will be awarded December 15, when the board meets in Bismarck.
