Cleveland Indians Take The Dodgers Off Their Feet In Sunday's Game; Score 8 to 1

Wambagans Makes Triple Play in Fifth Inning; First Time it Has Been Done in World's Series Game; Bagby Pitches Fine Game.

Cleveland, Ohio, Oct. 11.—With the count games 2 in their favor in the battle for the baseball championship of the universe, the Cleveland Indians today were prepared to face the Brooklyn Dodgers in the sixth contest of the series, continuing their mad onrush of the last two days and that tonight the world's championship pennant would be within one game of their grasp.

The Dodgers somewhat downcast over two successive drubbings, were far from beaten in spirit, however. With Sherron Smith, the brilliant southpaw who sent Cleveland back from Brooklyn on the short end of the third series game, scheduled to hurl, they felt the turning point had been reached and that by evening they again would be on even terms with the American league champions.

To Use Mails.

Manager Tris Speaker planned to send his youthful southpaw, Walter Mails, to the mound. While Mails had only a few major league career, his work has been on a par with that of the veterans. Coming into the league in midsummer from the Pacific coast and after a failure as a big league pitcher in Brooklyn, the youngster won six straight games when Cleveland was on the verge of being shoved out of the pennant race. In Brooklyn the third game of the world series, after Caldwell had been knocked out of the box in the first inning he went in and kept the Dodgers away from the plate until late in the game when he was taken out for a pinch hitter. Mails, however, had never started a super series contest, while Smith is a veteran.

Back of the Cleveland team today was a city which had lost interest in everything but baseball and which no longer even gave Brooklyn a chance to win the series. On the streets corners, in the hotels, the restaurants, the theatres and everywhere the only subject discussed was baseball and to Cleveland "baseball" means Jim Dunn's Indians.

The Cleveland roster had been on the edge of the championship grater for years and now that the big explosion has come they have lost all sense of equilibrium and are pulling, tugging, yearning and yelling for the world victory that is within their sight.

There was, however, somewhat of a cessation of the tenacious which characterized the city during the early days of the franchise, for the fans seemingly felt that they had sealed Mount Olympus and now had only to sit back and enjoy the fruits of their conquest.

The attitude of the club's backers was indicated in the shortness of the line at the bleacher gates last night and early this morning. Of twenty on guard at 6 o'clock last night, only four were there to see the game. The other sixteen were "speculators"—holding their place in line for sale.

By midnight, however, the line had approached the proportions of previous four days. Those waiting on the bleacher gates to open had brought their boxes, tables and other comforts and played cards, matched coins and found other ways to pass the time. Before daylight candles were used to illuminate the impromptu card tables.

A Game of Wonders.

Yesterday's game still was the main topic under discussion today. It was a game of wonders.

Wambagans' triple play, Smith's homer after the sizzler O'Neill had been purposely passed so Grimes could get to the pitcher, Bagby will live long in the baseball records. The first two never before had been duplicated in a world's series.

Fielding which was brilliant and sensational and at the same time steady, hitting which came when hitting was needed, kept the thousands of spectators jumping to their feet.

Incidentally the game produced several instances of inside baseball strategy, but again in each case Brooklyn was the sufferer and Cleveland the gainer.

In the first inning with the bases full Smith took two powerful swings

at Grimes' teasers and missed each. With the count two and one, Grimes decided to try to slip one over, for a score logically would expect a pitcher to waste one or two in a case like that. But Smith sent Grimes' fast straight pitch over the right field fence and the grinning war dance around the bases was on.

Again in the third Grimes tried to slip another one past Smith, firmly convinced that he would outguess the batter that time. Smith tripled. Apparently Grimes had not been fully informed on Smith's weakness, for American league pitchers say he is the greatest speed hitter in the game but comparatively weak on slow balls.

Grimes tried again to outguess Cleveland by passing O'Neill to pitch to Bagby, but the result of that effort also now is history.

Trick Again.

Grimes on another occasion in the first inning planned to ambush Cleveland. With Jamieson on second and Wambagans on first, the Brooklyn pitcher attempted the play which helped make Noodles Brown famous years ago. He told Sheehan to stick to third. He pitched the ball on the outside to Speaker—a left handed batter, so that a "bunt" would roll down the third base line. As he let go of the ball Grimes dashed for the third base line, planning to snatch the ball, whirled sharply—Brown always did it on one foot—and shoot the sphere to third for a forceout and a possible double play. Everything went according to schedule until Grimes went to turn for the throw to third. He felt, the bases were set, and he hit his record-breaking smash.

With southpaws in the box today, both managers planned to make the usual changes in the line-ups so as to increase the number of right handed hitters.
