EUREKA, Nev., March 14.—Unexpectedly the recent rumors of more litigation between the Eureka Consolidated and Richmond companies turn out to be true. The Richmond, in this instance is the plaintiff. The necessary legal proceedings have been commenced and an injunction against Eureka is to be applied for immediately.

Penon Bill.

WASHINGTON, March 14.—A number of pension bills passed the Senate during the morning. Among them one granting fifty dollars a month to the widow of Rear Admiral Charles Wilkes.

Washington, March 14th.—House.—The House went into Committee of the Whole on the bill extending the time for the withdrawal of distilled liquors from bonds.

WASHINGTON, March 14.—SENATE.—Voorhees introduced a bill providing for the payment of all Customs duties and all other obligations of the United States in legal tender notes at par, except in cases where it is otherwise expressly stipulated on the face of the obligation or contract.

A Report on the Texas-Pacific Bill.

WASHINGTON, March 14.—The Senate Sub-Committee in charge of the various bills concerning continental railway communication on or near the thirty-second parallel, reported favorably on the Texas-Pacific project and submitted to the full Committee a copy of the bill agreed upon by the House Pacific Railroads Committee.

London, March 14.—Hobart Pasha has been ordered to sail for the coast of Thessaly.

London, March 14.—The British squadron of the Mediterranean is now at Besika Bay.

London, March 14.—It is reported that Greece will be admitted to the Congress.

Vienna, March 14.—The Hungarian delegation to-day voted in Committee a grant of 3,720,000 florins for urgent and extraordinary army and navy requirements.

Constantinople, March 14.—At the request of Layard the Sultan has approved a charter for Protestants of Turkey similar to that passed by the Greek Armenian church.

Vienna, March 14.—Russia has intimated her desire that the Congress meet on the thirtieth of March.

Berlin, March 14.—The Anglo-Austrian demand that the whole of the Russo-Turkish agreement shall be submitted to the Congress arises from the belief that special and secret arrangements have been entered into, independent of the principal treaty.

London, March 14.—The Wivern, a turret ship built for the Southern Confederacy but detained by the Government and ever since moored in the harbor, has been brought to Devonport Dockyards to be prepared for commission.

London, March 14.—In the House of Commons this afternoon Sir Stafford Northcote, in reply to a question, said the Government had agreed to take part in the Congress.

Twenty-six Persons Drowned.

Brest, France, March 14.—Thirty-six persons attending a fair here were drowned to-day by the capsizing of their barge.

Heavy Storms in Ohio—Crop Prospects.

Cincinnati, March 14.—Advices from the interior of this State indicate that the season of the past two days has been one of much severity. A great amount of damage has been done to property generally, and especially railroad property.

The Gazette publishes dispatches from fifty-seven points in Southern Ohio, Indiana and Northern Kentucky, from which it appears that the prospect for a large crop of wheat is exceeding good.
