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European Cable News.

London, March 25th.—A Vienna correspondent says the full text of the treaty of San Stefano has renewed the strong anti-Russian feeling there. There is no difference of opinion about the real meaning of the treaty. It is not Russian preponderance, but Russian rule in Europe.

ROME, March 25th.—Vice Admiral De Brocchi, not Admiral Marini, as first stated, is Minister of Marine in the new Cabinet. The ministry is weak and is not likely to secure a majority in the Chamber of Deputies.

CAPE TOWN, March 25.—There is every prospect of an early close of war. The Kafirs say they are tired of it. Their chief is reported as begging for mercy.

Booth's Land and Water Bill. WASHINGTON, March 25th.—The bill introduced by Senator Booth for the appointment of a commission to investigate public lands provides for refunding all fees or commissions paid by innocent parties for locations of soldiers' homestead scrip subsequently cancelled because found void or fraudulent. It provides further that in all cases where homestead or timber culture or other entries of public lands have been or may be hereafter cancelled from conflict, or where from any cause, the entry has been allowed and cannot be confirmed, the fees and commissions shall be returned upon the surrender of the receipt and the relinquishment of all claims to said lands.
