Sacramento—Cold Poison—Closing the Broken Ice.

SACRAMENTO, April 4th.—Last night about 11 o'clock, a son-in-law of Hart Fellows, Receiver of the United States Land Office, Sacramento District, took a room at the Tremont Hotel, on J street. The landlord found the body of the dead in his bed. He had poisoned himself with strychnine. The contractors for closing the break in the levee below the city have built 2500 feet successfully, and it is believed that if no washout takes place, the gap will be closed by Saturday night. In this case all the water in R street will run off in one day. The freight train from the East, due here at 9 A. M., did not arrive till 11 o'clock this afternoon. It was detained by an accident on the hill. A special freight train broke in two at a point three miles east of Emigrant and ran together together again. One car was thrown from the track and fourteen others were more or less broken. No one was injured.

Portland, Oreg., April 4.

While the steamer Gussie Tallair was on her way down to Astoria from here yesterday the second officer, James Hayde, fell down the forward hatch sustaining fatal injuries. Deceased was about 37 and a native of England.

Albany, N. Y., April 4.

The Albany State Convention met at Albany this afternoon, and after effecting a permanent organization, appointing committees, etc., adjourned until to-morrow, when the State ticket will be nominated.

Virginia News from Virginia City.

VIRGINIA, Nev., April 4.—The report that the gold vein of the 1700 level of the Sierra Nevada is in ore is denied by the Superintendent. The west side of the vein of the 1900 foot level of the Ophir is in fine ore. Assays are rumored to run as high as \$200, but this is not official. Ore was found sooner than expected, indicating that the ledge is widening. Bullion shipment to-day, Consolidated Virginia \$168,747.

San Francisco, April 4.

He seemed to be afflicted with the vertigo.

New York, April 4.

This afternoon it is positively asserted at Police headquarters that Madame Restelle had sailed for Europe, and that a body had been purchased for the purpose of passing off as hers at the funeral.
