MOJAVE, June 27.—John Wilson, E. S. Baker, D. C. Madison, J. H. Wildy, C. W. Hawks, C. W. Francis and wife, L. J. F. Heagren, Capt. Mellon.

Murder in the First Degree.—The Damage to the Wheat Crop—Miss Jernard—Fourth of July.

SAN BERNARDINO, June 27.—The jury in the case of Patterson, for the murder of Barrett, after six hours deliberation, rendered a verdict of murder, in the first degree. Sentence will be pronounced on Monday next.

From W. S. Tittle, who has made a thorough canvass of the county for the sale of agricultural implements, it is learned that the total of wheat from rust will be fully 4,000 acres, or 120,000 bushels, and a total loss in grand cash of \$144,000.

It is rumored that some mines and mining property at Bear Valley, belonging to Lucky Baldwin and Richard Garvey, have been taken possession of by a party of jumpers. Mr. Garvey, accompanied by the Deputy Sheriff, has gone to the scene of dispute, when the rightful owners will be placed in possession.

R. S. Swing, county delegate elect to the Constitutional Convention, will orate on the coming Monday at the residence of John Brown, Jr., who will read the Declaration, and S. P. Waite act as Marshal.

San Francisco's Disgraced Attache.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 27.—William Gerhold, German attache, thirty-five, committed suicide last evening at his residence, 233 Sixth street, by cutting his throat with a razor. Cause, whiskey.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 27.—Last night a hackman, named Thomas Dowling, who had been on a spree, became disgusted with life and swallowed a dose of morphia. He was at once removed to the City Prison Hospital for medical treatment, where he died early this morning.

A Heavy Incendiary Fire.

DUTCH FLAT, June 27.—An incendiary fire occurred at Little York last night at 12 o'clock, destroying thirteen dwellings, one boarding-house and one powder house. The powder house contained 1,400 pounds of dynamite powder, and its explosion demolished the Little York Water Company's office, injuring Superintendent D. W. C. Morgan and killing six men.

The conclusion was so severe that it shook the town of Dutch Flat, three miles distant, as violently as a heavy shock of earthquake and aroused the whole town.

The incendiaries started the fire at both ends of the Little York Company's barn, cut the fire hose, broke the pipe and shut off the supply of water. No insurance except on the boarding house.

The Vote of Sutter County.

MARYSVILLE, June 27.—From the best information obtainable, the vote in Sutter county will stand on delegates at large: Non-Partisan, 350; Workingmen, 20. Returns come in slowly, and nothing more definite will be obtained until the count is made.

WASHINGTON, June 27th.—The War Department has issued orders requiring all military headquarters to be established at military posts. This does not affect Gen. Sheridan, who remains in his present quarters at Chicago, because they are Government buildings there to be used for the purpose. As Generals McDowell at the Presidio, and Pope at Leavenworth, are already at military posts, the new arrangement does not affect them.

The headquarters of the Department of Arizona will also remain at Prescott. General Hancock, commanding the Military Division of the Pacific, goes to Governor's Island, New York harbor; General Howard to Fort Vancouver, Oregon; General Terry to Fort Snelling; General Ord to San Antonio (Texas) arsenal; General Aguirre to Newport, Barracks, and Kentucky. The Division Department and personal staff in each case are included with the commanding officers. Gen. Crook, of the Department of the Platte, telegraphed to seven military buildings must be erected at Omaha, barracks for officers' quarters, which give rise to the wild and probably absurd rumor that the headquarters may be removed to Camp Douglas, near Salt Lake City. In every case the recent order of Congress, that no allowance for officers' quarters shall be made, will be strictly enforced.

Reducing Them to the Ranks. [From the Virginia Chronicle.]

Military and judicial titles are nearly as common on the Comstock as are diamond shirt-studs among the hackmen and barbers of San Francisco. Let a stranger pick up a report of a trial in one of our courts, and the chances are it will read like this: "Judge Whitman contended that certain evidence was inadmissible. Judge Mesick read from decisions of the Supreme Court precedents clearly establishing its inadmissibility. Judge Belknap held that the evidence was admissible, but Judge Seely took diametrically opposite grounds. Judge Rising thought that the precedents cited in support of the admissibility of the evidence were not in strictly analogous cases, and a precedent should not be admitted in this case. Judge Aude then addressed the jury, urging the acquittal of the prisoner," etc. That hapless stranger would not doubt cudge his brain a long while before he found out which of all these "Judges" was really the Judge, and would naturally feel like sending out a

bell-ringer to discover what had become of that evidence.

The plethora of military titles is almost equally nauseating and ridiculous. Every one-horse mine superintendent soon becomes a "Colonel," and the unutilized stranger, after being paralyzed by the overdose of "Judges," might find an antidote by turning to the mining reports. He would learn that "Colonel" Jenks was putting down a new windlass on the Nipperfield shaft; that "Captain" Spendifree was making good headway with the drift on the 10-foot level of the Assessor mine; that "General" Blowhard was getting a new section in his old pump, and that any amount of military chiefs was carrying on active sapping and mining operations in every direction.

This is all both. The Chronicle's reporters have always had instructions in their Court reports to apply the title of "Judge" only to the person who occupies the bench, and they very rarely forget themselves in that particular. And now the flat goes forth to reduce to the superintendents to the ranks. No more of this "General," "Colonel" or "Captain" business. The visiting stranger will, no doubt, gratefully thank the Chronicle for its consideration, and, doubtless, even the old settlers will experience some relief.

Result of the Election.

Later returns modify the figures given by counties in our issue of yesterday chiefly in favor of the Non-Partisans. As instances, we may cite Siskiyou county, which in the table was given as 100 majority Non-Partisan (estimated), a dispatch to the Record-Union from the County Clerk places it at 400 majority Non-Partisan. Also, Tolumne county was not given in the table—the county not having been heard from; the County Clerk places the Non-Partisan majority at 108. Butte county was given by the Record-Union as 450 majority Non-Partisan, when the latest returns warrant the claim of 900 majority for the Non-Partisan ticket in that county. Other changes in the same direction might be noted. It may therefore now be stated as a final conclusion, that the entire Non-Partisan ticket at large has been successful, giving the Non-Partisans a decided majority over all others in the Convention. The election of a Non-Partisan success to us on the reports received on the night of the election day, and have grown stronger every day since. The announcement made in this paper on the morning after the election of a Non-Partisan success has been fully verified. Figures for tabulation are being rapidly received, and the full details will be presented at an early day.—Sac. Record-Union, June 25.
