The Editor's Answer to various Questions.

His views on the Power of the State to deal with Aliens.

We epitomize below the answers of General Butler to the six questions propounded by Kearney on the power of the State to interpose obstructions to the domiciliation of Chinese.

1. Under the decision of the Supreme Court of the United States, and under the treaty, a State cannot by its organic law or legislative action prevent or hinder the immigration of Chinese.

2. The Fourteenth Amendment to the Constitution of the United States applies only to naturalized and native-born citizens.

3. I am of opinion that, either by the organic law of a State or by ordinary legislative act the rights of fisheries in its inland waters can be restricted to the subjects of the em- pire of China.

4. I am of opinion that, under the decision of a Court, no State can levy a capitation tax upon the subjects of the Empire of China as a condition, precedent to the landing upon the shores of that part of the United States within its limits.
