Understanding that a great many more would like to participate in the enjoyment of an excursion to Santa Monica and return, I would ask you to inform the public in the next Delta that I will charter another car to Santa Monica and return, arriving in Los Angeles at 1 p. m. the day of leaving Tulare and will remain there that afternoon and the next day and night, to be spent in visiting the new and old Missions, San Gabriel, Shorb's, Wilson's and Rose's orange orchards, Lucky Baldwin's ranch, Sierra Madre Villa, taking dinner and returning to Los Angeles via the Arroyo Seco, and remaining in Los Angeles that night; and will then go to Santa Monica, giving the excursionists a week there and ten baths; the whole to cost \$35 per ticket. By getting the whole party sixty together, I can obtain a reduction at the hotels, so that \$35 will pay just even for the whole trip, enabling the excursionists to see all the sights. This is a great deal cheaper than any one can go and pay his own bills, and the success of the enterprise will assist in inaugurating a system of excursions to other points. I want to start by the 1st of September, if possible, returning by the 9th or 10th. For those wanting to return soon, special arrangements can be made as before.
