Another Bank Suspension in San Francisco. SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 3.—The Farmers' and Merchants' Bank of Savings closed its doors this morning, and posted up a notice to the effect that the Directors had ordered the bank into liquidation, and that assuring the depositors that the assets were ample to pay all their dues.

A REVENGEFUL RED. The Tragedy that Disturbed an Alaska Village. (Correspondence of the S. F. Chronicle.)

KLAWOCK CANNERY, Prince of Wales Island, Alaska, August 12.—A terrible tragedy was enacted in the Indian village at this place a few days ago. An Indian was sitting alone in his wigwam, meditating perhaps upon the departed glories of his race, or, more likely, upon the increasing obstacles in the way of obtaining a supply of the inspiring "hoehenoo," when a young woman entered from a neighboring lodge, and thinking the man was asleep at an unreasonable hour, she gave him a sharp push which threw him over against something or other which cut his face, causing a flow of blood. The brave muttered a curse, and the women quickly retreated, thinking but little of the accident, for an accident it was, so far as the trifling injury went. Nothing further transpired that evening.

THE DAMAGED WARRIOR. Remaining indoors nursing his anger. The following morning, when the woman and her husband were quietly eating their breakfast of dried salmon, and anticipating no harm, the wounded man walked into the hut, raised his rifle and sent a bullet crashing through the skull of the man. He then rushed upon the woman, whipped a heavy knife from his belt, ripped her open, and leaving husband and wife dead upon the floor.

San Francisco—Heart Disease the Cause of Baigner's Death. SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 3.—An autopsy on the body of ex-Governor Haight last evening showed that heart disease was the cause of his death.

Ex-Supervisor Kelly, who killed Russell, has not yet been re-arrested, which occasions considerable comment.

A Petition to Bankruptcy. SAN FRANCISCO, Sept. 3.—Among those who filed petitions in bankruptcy at a late hour Saturday night was J. A. Stanford. His schedule makes his liabilities \$193,959.29, all unsecured, of which \$85,000 is due Leland Stanford and \$21,700 due the estate of W. A. Bourn. Assets.

Kearney to Newark. NEWARK, N. J., Sept. 3.—Kearney addressed about 6,000 persons, mostly workmen, at Military Park, this city, last evening. A large number of his hearers were attracted from which he spoke. As usual, he stripped off his coat and rolled up his sleeves before commencing. A brass band was present. Joseph A. Beecher, editor of the greenback organ, was chosen to preside. He introduced Kearney, who spoke for an hour and three quarters. The audience was enthusiastic, but orderly, and applauded frequently. Kearney said he intended to talk as an ignoramus to ignorant men. He had been charged with talking for pay, but he did not want to be classed with Henry Water and Bread Beecher, who charged a dollar and a half to lecture. He continued in the same strain at the local cities, denouncing the slimy sheets of Newark and the proprietors as slimy lumps of hell, and praising the greenback organ. Speaking of lecherous capitalists, he requested the reporters to spell it "lecherous." He ascribed the present troubles to Republican and Democratic thieves, who have oppressed the workingmen down to 20 cents and find their own soap. He strongly advocated greenbacks, saying that with them we could sweep away the lecherous capitalists. The yellow fever pestilence, he said, was due to Congress, who had let the leeches get on instead of employing poor men to rebuild them. He asked his audience whether they would vote the greenback-labor ticket next Fall, and to an affirmative vote said that fifteen thousand men had voted to support the ticket, and therefore it must be elected. He then reviewed the Chinese labor argument and repeated the story concerning the black crew. He denominated Secretary Sherman, saying that the latter's recent speech was never delivered. He urged active political work next November, and closed with a rhetorical quotation. He used the same epithets previously reported. At the mention of Butler's name he called for three cheers. Altogether, with the exception of the local allusion, his speech was little different from his others.
