Teachers' Institute—Third Day.

At the reassembling of the Institute at 9 A. M., Prof. McDonald in the Chair, the roll called made an exhibit of 31 present, 31 absent and 7 excused.

"Hall Columbia" was well rendered by the Committee on Music. The critic's report was something of a lecture, although quite apropos.

The Committee on Queries reported only two questions which were algebraic and, by request of the Chair, they were passed without demonstration.

Prof. Guinn introduced the subject of training in the use of language, by first hinting at some of the obstacles to be met in the study of grammar.

Mr. Mann, by request of the Chair, addressed a few remarks to the subject by saying first, that the ground had been pretty well covered.

J. R. Eriery gave a very interesting talk on the subject of school libraries, giving statistical and other information of great value to teachers.

Messrs. Warren, Henderson and Guinn followed, adding to the interest of the subject.

Prof. McDonald postponed his report and Prof. Martling took up the study of Hamlet.

Dr. Widney then read a most instructive and entertaining essay on Psychological Education.

The Institute adjourned until 9 o'clock A. M. to-day.

The Drift of Popular Feeling with regard to the City Election.

The newspaper has been aptly defined as the brief chronicle and abstract of the times.

A genuine movement from a People's standpoint could not fail to result in the nomination of candidates for whom Democrats and Republicans could alike vote.

A Committee or Convention entrusted with the responsible duty of representing the whole community could not fail to select the best men amongst us.

In the face of such nominations, neither the Republican nor Democratic parties would deem it expedient to make partisan nominations.

It would leave the issue between the People's party and the Workingmen.
