Small-Pox on Shipboard at San Francisco.

SAN FRANCISCO, Nov. 19.—A case of small-pox was discovered by the quarantine officers yesterday morning aboard the British bark River Lure, which arrived from Adressand, Scotland, on the 6th instant. She was visited at that time by the quarantine officers, who pronounced her all right. The case is that of an apprentice who shipped at Adressand. The quarantine officers who contacted the disease in the Chinese quarter of this city yesterday. The patient was removed to the Pest House and the vessel crew placed in quarantine.

Another Delegate Dead.

SACRAMENTO, Nov. 19.—Col. Jas. Madison Strong, Delegate to the Convention from Mariposa and Merced, died at his rooms on K street at 11:15 this morning of pneumonia. The deceased was elected by the Convention to supply the vacancy caused by the demise of George M. Hartwick, who died between the election in June and the assembling of the Convention at Col. Strong was well known throughout the State as a pioneer, with his brother, in cotton-growing in California in the San Joaquin Valley plains. Although from presidential reasons, he had not voted up to the present time, he entered largely into the business, he was preparing plans for the establishment of a cotton factory. Deceased came to California from Mississippi, but was a native of Clark county, Georgia. He was born in 1831 and came to California in 1850.

South American News.

PANAMA, Nov. 7.—Advices from Chile state that serious riots, resulting in the killing and wounding of 40 people, had occurred in Santiago. Mounted police and cavalry were called out and made several charges before the mob dispersed. The trouble was caused by an attempt to lay violent hands upon the writer of certain articles on the boundary question, in which he took ground favorable to the Argentine Republic. While the schooner Little Minnie was on her way from Golden to Colan, with a crew and passengers numbering seven persons, she capsized. All on board were drowned except one colored man. The captain of the Warrior reports that while passing through the Boca Huloos, near Trinidad, he saw the ship Shandora, of Liverpool, ashore and in two hours saved 240 Coolies from her. The remainder had been landed previously. The Pandora was on her way from Trinidad to Calcutta loaded with Coolies, whose term was served out.
