A Much Needed Reformation.

We confess that there are some respects in which the United States appear to us to be away below the people of Europe. In those professedly monarchical countries, as a general thing, the wealthy pay the poor the compliment of being honest. If they fail to carry out this unwritten but tacit contract between the rich and the poor, the laws are so administered as to punish them severely. No rank or station avails to save a powerful and aristocratic swindler in Europe. Should an English Earl murder a yeoman in cold blood it is quite certain that he would be hanged, while it is by no means certain that if a ward politician murders a wealthy citizen in the United States he will get his just deserts.

There is one respect in which the laxity which characterizes so many phases of American life and morals impresses us very painfully: it is the people's dishonesty.
