Since the bees have hardly left their hives. Not only that, but the flowers themselves are not nearly as profuse as in other seasons, and many varieties, rich in honey, have developed and gone, yielding no honey whatever. On Sunday morning there was a heavy fog in the valley and some dew in the Sweetwater, and for the first time during the season bees were out on Sunday in full force. Still an examination of the sage blossoms showed them to contain but very little honey, hardly enough to pay for the "wear and tear" of the bees in their labors to get at even that little. If the balance of the season continues as up to the present time, the honey crop of this portion of the County at least, will be a total failure as in 1879, though there is yet time, with the present state of vegetation and with sufficient fogs and dews, to secure perhaps a third or half crop; otherwise not a pound of honey will be produced for export this year. In the mountains further inland, bees are reported as doing a little better, yet in no instance do we hear that the sanguine expectations of a fair crop held a month ago will be realized.
