

LATE TELEGRAMS.

And Still They Come.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 29.—The British steamship Belgic arrived this morning from Hong Kong and Yokohama with 596 Coolies. One case of small pox is reported, and the steamer has been quarantined.

Consular Court to Assemble.

SAN FRANCISCO, June 29.—The Consular Court, called to investigate the cause of the loss of the British ship, Lammermoor, will convene here tomorrow morning. The British consul, W. Lane Booker, will preside.

Arizona News.

TUCSON, June 29.—The First National Bank of Tucson received notice to-day from the Secretary of the Treasury that it had been designated U. S. Depository. The Territory has suffered considerably since the abolition of the Depository here last Fall, inasmuch as all public money had to be transferred to and from San Francisco.

The rainy season has set in with a steady fall. It continues in intervals yesterday and last night throughout Southern Arizona. Mining interests are recovering. Good reports come from all the principal camps in Southern Arizona.

FROM THE CAPITAL.

Budget of Political and Other News from Washington.

ANOTHER GUTTEAU CRANK. WASHINGTON, June 28.—Much uneasiness is felt by Mrs. Scoville's friends in regard to her presence here. She is very excitable and difficult to control, and while her brother persists she is perfectly sane, there is no doubt she is more crazy than Gutteau and liable to do something desperate before the week ends. One man expressed his belief this morning that she was liable to shoot the President if he persists in his refusal to grant a respite to her brother.

GUTTEAU'S SPIRITUAL ADVISER.

Hicks, the spiritual adviser of Gutteau, turns out to be a political preacher and was chairman of the Florida delegation in the Chicago Convention and one of the first Southern delegates who came over to Arthur when the Vice Presidency was being discussed. He is a very great admirer of Arthur and his previous record as a statesman had doubtless commended him to the prisoner.

THE CHRISTIANITY CASE.

The Christianity divorce suit, that has offended the nostrils of the public for a year past, was settled to-day by the withdrawal of Mrs. Christianity's answer to the original bill filed by the ex-Senator. Her counsel have abandoned the case and the ex-Senator will be given a divorce. The evidence has been sadly against the woman.

The Harrisburg Convention.

HARRISBURG, Pa., June 28.—On assembling in the afternoon Dallas, of Philadelphia, was made permanent chairman. Resolutions were adopted protesting against "bossism," political assessments, spoils system, denouncing all repudiation, State and Federal; denouncing the spoliation of the State Treasury and the pardon of those guilty of subverting official trusts; stating that the Republican party is based on fraud, force and corruption; and demanding just apportionment; declaring against monopolies, and in sympathy with labor seeking protection. Robertson was nominated for Governor, and the convention adjourned until tomorrow.

Another Prize Fight.

GREENSBORO, Pa., June 28.—A brutal prize fight came off to-day just across the line in West Virginia, between two colored pugilists, T. B. Walling and Bryan Campbell. The fight was witnessed by several hundred people. Campbell won the fight in thirty rounds; time, forty-one minutes. Walling broke his right hand in the thirtieth round and his little finger of the left hand in the thirty-first round.

Double Murder and Suicide.

CINCINNATI, June 28.—P. L. Kopen, living at Milton and Young streets, this morning shot his wife and daughter, aged 19, then himself.

Catholic Knights.

CLEVELAND, O., June 28.—The principal business of the Catholic Knights' Convention to-day was the passage of a resolution of fealty to the Pope and of thanks for courtesies.

Democratic Nomination.

TOLEDO, O., June 28.—The Democrats of the Sixth District nominated W. L. Hill for Congress.

Sham Hanging and Real.

CHICAGO, June 28th.—Gutteau was hanged yesterday at Las Vegas, N. M., in effigy as a celebration of a victory achieved by the American residents over the Mexicans in the contest over incorporation of the city.

Illinois Congressman Nominated.

CHICAGO, June 28.—A Decatur, Ill., special says: The Fourteenth District Congressional Republican Convention nominated J. H. Rowell, of Bloomington.

Illinois Republican Convention.

SPRINGFIELD, June 28.—To-day's Republican Convention was attended by the entire 792 delegates, making the largest Republican Convention ever held in the State. Senator George Hunt was elected temporary chairman. The usual committees were appointed and the Convention took a recess until two o'clock.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

On reassembling the Convention proceeded to nominate candidates for State Treasurer; Gen. J. C. Smith, of Chicago, was nominated on first ballot. For State Superintendent of Schools, Charles W. Stratton, of Jefferson county, was nominated on fourth ballot. A member of the State Central Committee was appointed. Resolutions affirming principles of the Republican party in favor of tariff, civil service reform, and expressing sympathy with laboring men were adopted.

Mr. Sterling, June 28.—The rain yesterday flooded the streets of Frenchburg eight to ten feet. Three dwellings were swept away. The postoffice and contents disappeared.
