LATE TELEGRAMS. (SPECIAL TO THE HERALD.) A Madman Death and Suicide. SAN FRANCISCO, March 2.—Jonathan Kitzinger, a well known and highly respected citizen of San Francisco, died very suddenly of a cerebral aneurism.

Shooting Marriage. CHICAGO, March 1.—Between 8 and 9 o'clock to-night, James Elliott, a pugilist, and Jerry Dunn, a well known sportsman and man about town, met in the saloon and restaurant of Wm. Lagdon, alias Appleton, alias Appelle Bill, an eccentric and confidence man, and began shooting, with the result of Elliott being killed and Dunn wounded in two places. The trouble date back to the time when Earl Hill and others came here from New York to meet Jim Maco and Slade with the view of arranging a match with Sullivan, whom Maco had backed by a person named Davies, who was seeking to make a match with the Moor.

Harbinger, March 2.—Col. A. K. McClure, of the Philadelphia Times, was arrested to-day on a charge of libel on the death of John Gallagher, the watchman at the Capitol, who was put out for a gross article published in the Times in reference to Irish Catholics. These clerical were distributed during a recent gubernatorial campaign preparing to be used against McClure by Gallagher and others. McClure was jailed.

Not Filled, but Suspended. CLEVELAND, O., March 2.—The President of the Cleveland Trust Co., J. W. Beaville, says the company has not failed. He has devised an extension of the paper that was being negotiated, pending the outcome of the depression in the iron trade. If it improves, the furnace can be started in forty-eight hours; if not, the affairs of the company will be wound up.

WASHINGTON, March 2.—The appropriations for the Pacific Coast in the River and Harbor Bill, as passed by the House, are: Oakland Harbor, \$30,000; Wilmington, \$50,000; Coos Bay, \$20,000; Yavapai, \$30,000; Sacramento river, \$60,000; San Joaquin, \$30,000; locks at the Cascades, \$125,000; Lower Willamette and Columbia, \$40,000; Coquille, \$7,000; mouth of the Columbia, \$73,000.

Valence of the Past Week. NEW YORK, March 2.—The business failures of the past seven days number 272; increase 42 as compared with the past week. They are distributed as follows: Retail stores, 100; Wholesale, 100; Manufacturers, 50; Banks, 10; Insurance, 10; Real estate, 10; Other, 10.

Large Woolen Mills Shut Down. DETROIT, March 2.—The Directors of the Dexter Woolen Mills, having decided to suspend operations. The corporation owns the three largest mills here. The employees, when the mills are in full operation number 350. The principal reason is the high price of wool.

Edmunds for President of the Senate. WASHINGTON, March 2.—The Republican members of the Senate held a caucus this morning and selected Edmunds as a candidate for president pro tem to succeed Davis. There was no opposition.

The Penalty for Bribing. COLUMBIA, Mo., March 2.—The jury in the case of J. D. Watson, a lobbyist, charged with an attempt to bribe Representative Black, of Cleveland, last winter, this morning returned a verdict of guilty. The penalty is from three to ten years in the penitentiary. Sentence was reserved.
