Hanged for Murder. PLACERVILLE, Cal., August 10.—James K. Page was executed here this morning at 8:15 for the murder of an unknown man at New York Ravine near Folsom, on May 8th last. The prisoner slept well last night, and ate a hearty breakfast this morning. His mother and his counsel accompanied a clergyman, visited him early this morning. He maintained the same stolid indifference to his fate, and displayed all along during his trial and sentence. On the scaffold, after the reading of the death warrant when asked if he had anything to say, he said: "Give me a drink. When the officer asked him if he wanted a drink of water, he replied, "No; give me whisky." Under Sheriff Lovelock asked him if he wished his shoes removed. After hesitating a moment he said: "No; let 'em alone" after the cap and rope were adjusted, he uttered a profane explanation that the rope was choking him. At the completion of his prayer by the Rev. Tindall, the drop fell. Death was instantaneous, his pulse ceasing to beat after twenty-three throbs.
