It is reported that Osman Digna has been killed. Carl Luce was found dead near San Rafael Monday. The building trades' strike in New York continues.

The Commercial Bank of Brazil, Ind., has closed its doors. A fire in Portland, Or., partially destroyed two dwellings. A burglar was pursued in Rome by citizens Monday, and hanged.

General Gordon was safe June 11th, and had abundant provisions and ammunition. A stage was "held up" about ten miles from Reading Tuesday by a single high-way man.

A daily mail service has been established between Puget sound ports and Victoria, B. C. Upwards of 200 Indians are engaged in harvesting in Kern county. They came from the Needles.

The City Council of Chicago has abolished contract labor for prisoners in the House of correction. Owing to wet weather, alternating with sunshine, the grapes near Camden, N. J., are rotting on the vines.

A large timber fire was raging on the north side of the Calaveras river, near San Andreas, last week. Thomas Stephens, who left San Francisco on a bicycle April 23d, arrived at Albany, N. Y., Monday.

The output of cattle from Montana over the Northern Pacific this year is expected to aggregate 75,000 head. An Indian known as "Old Stock" died on the reservation in Yakima county, Or., last week at the ripe old age of 118.

Jean Bourbon, a Spaniard employed on a ranch near Merced, was fatally crushed last week by a derrick falling on him. The total number of entries at the Walla Walla Land Office for the year past is 1782; total acreage taken up, 265,538.20 acres.

A young man named Emmett Blackwell, of Weaverville, died last night from injuries received by the bursting of a cannon, which was used to celebrate the nomination of Cleveland.
