FORMS OF CONTRACTS SIGNED.

The Way Now Open For Growers of Citrus Fruits to Get the Top of the Markets.

The Orange Growers' Protective Union of Southern California is now in operation and as an example of how they are doing business there is appended hereto the form of contract being made with eastern and San Francisco commission merchants. The one here given is made at Denver, Col.

The Denver contract is similar to all others in eastern cities, Omaha, Kansas City, Minneapolis, Chicago, etc., etc.

THE PARTIES CONTRACT.

Memorandum of agreement between the Orange Growers' Protective Union, a corporation, of Southern California, and the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co., of Denver, Col.

This said corporation hereby appoints the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. its sole agent in the State of Colorado and the Territories of New Mexico, Arizona, Wyoming and Utah, for the handling of all oranges and other fruits, green and dried, controlled by it.

The said corporation agrees to pay to the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. a commission of seven and one-half (7 1/2) per cent on all sales made in said State or Territory, whether on commission or F. O. B. in California; any orders coming direct to and corporation from said State or Territory shall be referred to the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co.

It is not the intention of the Orange Growers' Protective Union to antagonize any established business.

The Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. agrees to distribute the oranges and fruit of the Union among all reputable houses in that line doing business in said State and Territory, and to sell such produce, in as far as possible, as sub-agent and factoring agent with such amounts of fruit as it can handle.

The Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. further agrees to diligently further the interests of said Union, and to explain its objects to the trade, to appoint one or more suitable sub-agents at all proper places, to take orders, etc., in the State and Territory named.

The Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, fix the prices at which all fruit coming from the Union shall be sold, and as to oranges the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. agrees for themselves and sub-agents to sell such oranges at the prices so fixed.

All agents and sub-agents shall adhere rigidly to prices so named to them by the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. who shall report them and such change made in them to the Orange Growers' Protective Union, who reserves the right of supervision over such prices to the extent of equalizing them in different districts.

As to the oranges the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. shall from time to time, as often as may be necessary, fix the price of bright clear fruit above that of dark or smutty, and generally to sell such fruit at the prices of different markets, not making the good sell the poor. Fancy navel oranges shall bring fancy prices.

It is understood that the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. shall be deprived of the agency of said corporation. In fixing prices due consideration shall be made to all circumstances—rather of market, freight, etc. Economic prices shall be contemplated, but not fair prices, which will remunerate growers and encourage consumption.

All agents and sub-agents shall keep books showing business done for said corporation, which books shall at all times be open to inspection by agents of said corporation.

All memoranda of sales shall show the quantity of fruit sold, at what price, and name and address of purchaser; and fruit packed in any way shall be made for each market.

The Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Company agrees to sell all sub-agents strictly to these provisions. Agents are to give date of arrival of cars in making returns.

In case of fruit arriving in bad order at any point the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. shall be held responsible for the same, and the Union shall be promptly advised of any such case being given.

The Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Company also agrees to keep the said corporation fully advised from time to time of the state of the market in their district and of other matters of interest. The commission of 7 1/2 per cent named herein to be paid to the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. shall be paid to the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co. as soon as possible after the sale of the fruit.

Witness: That, Whereas, said party of the First part controls in large degree the orange crop of California, and Whereas, said party of the Second part handles and controls in large degree the market for the sale of oranges upon the Pacific slope, and Whereas, it is mutually desired between said parties to deal with each other for the good of all.

Now, therefore, said parties mutually covenant and agree to and with each other as follows, to wit: First—Said party of the First part will ship to said parties of the Second part and to none other parties such oranges as shall be it or on its account be sold upon the Pacific coast. Said oranges so, as aforesaid, to be shipped to the principal places of business in California and country of Los Angeles, in said State, the party of the First part, and Dalton Bros., Nevada & Nevada, and the Struby-Estabrook Mercantile Co., Littlefield, Alliance & Co., A. Lusk & Co., San Lorenzo Fruit Co., and L. G. Stenrohn & Co., all doing business at the city and county of San Francisco, in said State, the parties of the second part.
