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TELEGRAPHIC. Scheme to Sell the Sandwich Islands TO A EUROPEAN SYNDICATE.

A Good Way for the Printers to Accumulate—Returns From Oregon.

Special in the Herald by the Associated Press. SAN FRANCISCO, June 10.—The Call this morning prints a statement of a prominent resident of the Sandwich Islands in which the gentleman says that the native legislators have formulated a gigantic scheme to dispose of the islands.

A bill was recently introduced by the Government to authorize the procurement of a loan of \$2,000,000. It is understood that the bill will be amended, making the amount five times as large.

Mr. Hoffman, who is now in the island acting as an agent for the immigration of Portuguese to the islands, has given the King the assurance that a syndicate of European capitalists are willing and anxious to furnish the money.
