Legislation and Politics.

During the last national political campaign, we frequently urged that what the country was most in need of in the way of legislation was that Congress should let business matters entirely alone, that what the material interests of the Union would flourish most on would be to allow men of affairs, those thoroughly conversant with finances and industries, and most vitally interested in their prosperity, to attend to these things themselves in their own way.

Time sufficient to test the truth of such doctrines has elapsed since Mr. Cleveland's inauguration to the chief executive office of the nation. He and his advisors and colleagues have most conscientiously followed out the policy outlined. The result is most evident on all sides.

But we do not care to appeal to our own ratio-nations in support of these statements. Fortunately, we are now given the view of a man on this point, which probably may be accepted as conclusive. Jay Gould stands at the head of the financiers and industrial exploiters of the land.

Here is the opinion entertained by nearly all the ablest men of the greatest experience in affairs of the country. The best policy for business is a conservative and stable policy. The worst is an empirical policy, tinkering with things and changing the bases on which values rest.

But if this be so, the duty of every voter in the land to his own interests would be to see that the Democratic party shall be maintained in power. The other great national party in all its twenty-five years of power showed an utter incapability of learning to mind its own business. The spirit which called the Republican party into power was a pragmatic Puritanism always intent on minding the affairs of other people, even at the risk of neglecting itself.

During the active sway of Republicanism, it developed at all points a radical empiricism, which would let nothing rest. Its restless spirit must be experimenting, tinkering, trying some radical change of policy. It has not changed this tendency one jot. The old spirit is still alive and will assert itself whenever the opportunity occurs.
