From the earliest symptoms (which are generally attributed to a "cold in the head") to the various and distressing stages through which the disease passes, the patient is ignorant of recovery, and rarely ever recovers. The disease is usually accompanied by a profuse discharge of mucus, which is not only a source of alarm, but also a source of weakness, and the patient is unable to attend to his business. BRONCHITIS. Acute Bronchitis is an inflammation of the mucous membrane of the bronchial tubes, and is one of the most common of the pulmonary diseases. If it ends in bronchitis it usually passes off as a cold on the chest, and still the patient does not feel as well. Soon after this cough appears, accompanied by a profuse discharge of a gummy mucus, followed by a hectic flush, loss of flesh and strength and night sweats continue, when the patient assumes all the appearances of having a genuine case of consumption. But this is simply catarrh of the lungs or chronic bronchitis.

In the later stage of the disease the mucous membrane of the larger bronchial tubes softens, while in the smaller tubes the cells of the lungs the mucous membrane becomes congested and indurated.
