A FRIENDLY GREETING. J. K. Stout Found Guilty of Stabbing a Man. The trial of J. K. Stout, charged with an assault with a deadly weapon, upon a man named Holdrich, took place in Judge Cheney's court yesterday. The complaining witness, Holdrich, stated that in November last he went into Stout's saloon and the defendant walked up to him and stabbed him without any provocation. The testimony of other witnesses confirmed this statement, but defendant on his own behalf said that he was drunk at the time and did not know he had an open knife in his hand. He had simply meant to tell Holdrich on the shoulder in a friendly manner, not having seen him for some time. The jury found Stout guilty as charged, but recommended him to the mercy of the court.
