They Do Well to Those Who Do Ill.

PRADO GUILLOTINED AT PARIS.

Leong Sing Hanged at San Francisco—Both Meet their Fate with Fortitude to the Last.

[Associated Press Dispatches to the Herald.]

PARIS, December 28.—Prado, the murderer of Marie Augustant, his mistress, January 14, 1886, was guillotined this morning in the Place de la Roquette. He preserved a firm demeanor to the last, and refused to confess. He declined the services of the chaplain.

An immense crowd collected outside the prison last night and remained until Prado had been executed. The rabble spent the time in singing comic songs and amusing themselves in boisterous ways. Prado slept well until 6 o'clock. He protested innocence of the murder of Marie Augustant to the last and declared against the injustice of this world. He refused to disclose his real name. When the jailers came to pinion his limbs he offered no resistance; while they were engaged in this operation he shed one tear. The sight of the guillotine appeared to hypnotize him. The execution was witnessed by 200 artists, newspaper men, actors, lawyers and politicians who possessed influence sufficient to obtain admission within the sentry lines to the Place de la Roquette. In fifty seconds after his appearance at the prison gate...

His bleeding head lay in a basket. In front of the prison where the execution took place were found a group of men among whom were seen some of the most distinguished men in France. Near a line of trees on the upper side of the path stood Mounet Sully, of the Comedie Francaise; near him Armand Sylvestre and Henri Rochefort; Alphonse Daudet was said to be present. Prado, in walking from the prison to the guillotine, showed no signs of fear. His arms were tightly pinioned behind his back. His heavy locks, seen to such advantage in the court-room, were gone. His apparel seemingly consisted of a heavy woolen undershirt and dark trousers. The shirt had been roughly cut away from about his neck and shoulders. In front of the guillotine the board stood upright to the height of five feet. As Prado neared the board...

A MOST DREADFUL SERIES OF INCIDENTS followed each other with the rapidity of lightning. Four burly men dressed in blouses of blue and white striped ducking, who had not been seen before, sprang forward, seized the condemned man, hurled him onward against the upright board, flung themselves upon him, and by their weight bore the struggling victim face downward to the top of the low platform that the board worked on, on a swivel and ran on rollers. In an instant it had been wheeled forward until the neck was under the glistening knife. Deibler, who had stood like a man of stone at the right of the guillotine during all this terrible scene, now reached forward and fixed a wooden collar over the back of the prisoner's neck. Then the knife sprung and the keen steel struck the neck as it might have collided with a rubber car spring. It went through, and the head of Prado lay among the shavings beyond.

LEONG SING HANGED. How the Highbinder Stolidly Faced His Fate. SAN FRANCISCO, December 28.—Leong Sing was hanged in the County Jail today for the murder of his uncle nearly three years ago. During the past few days the condemned man had exhibited the most stolid indifference to his fate and even up to within a few hours of his execution would not believe that he was to die. His cell mates were two fellow-countrymen and last night they made every effort to impress upon his mind the fact that...

THE CONDEMNED CHINAMAN AROSE early this morning and ate a hearty breakfast. He was removed to a cell near the gallows about 9 o'clock and made a request to be left alone a few moments, which was denied. He seemed to realize this morning that he would have to die, but it did not appear to cause him any anxiety whatever. HE REFUSED TO EMBRACE THE CHRISTIAN RELIGION. And would have nothing to say to the priest who called upon him. But little interest was taken in the execution and the crowd in the jail was small. Leong Sing was led out of his cell at 12 o'clock, and in a few minutes everything was ready and the trap was sprung. The murderer died without a struggle.

HE KILLED HIS WIFE WHILE DRUNK, BUT DIED GAME. WENIPPEG, December 28.—Webb Brandon, the wife murderer, was hanged this morning. He displayed great fortitude on the scaffold. The parting between Brandon and his three children was extremely affecting. Brandon killed his wife while drunk.

THE STEAMER SAMANA. What Became of Her in the Great Gates of Last Month? NEW YORK, December 28.—Speculation is rife on the Maritime Exchange over the possible fate of the Samana, which left here for Hayti and San Domingo on November 22d. Nothing has been heard of the vessel since. It may be recalled that the Samana's departure was signalized by a heated controversy between the then Haytian Consul, E. D. Bassett, and the Customs House officials. Bassett claimed the vessel carried arms and ammunition for the insurgents, and made strenuous efforts to have the vessel delayed until the cargo could be inspected. Collector Magone refused to interfere and the Samana cleared on November 25th. The eastern coast of the United States, the direct route of the Samana, was visited by one of the most severe storms ever experienced before. It is generally believed that she is lost. The Samana is an iron screw steamer of 545 gross tons, commanded by Capt. John James with a crew of eighteen.

MORE RACE WAR. A Bloody Battle Fought in the Old Dominion. FREDERICKSBURG, Va., December 28.—A bloody battle between blacks and whites is reported as having taken place at Tacketts Mills, Stafford county, on Christmas eve during a political discussion. This led to a wrangle between a white man named Bennett Hiften and

a colored man. Both indulged in personalities, which ended with a fight and a general riot was the result. Hiften was shot and instantly killed; his colored enemy was also shot. Twenty people are reported dangerously injured.

THE INDIANS DEPART. And Leave the Whites in Peace. ST. LOUIS, December 28.—The latest advices from the Indian Territory were received by letter from Oklahoma station. Indian scouts reported yesterday as having driven settlers from the place, suddenly departed, the chief having received information that his action is arbitrary and unauthorized. It is believed there will be no further interference with the whites who remain peaceable.

A FATAL WRECK. That is the Way with the Schooner Mary Swan. SAN FRANCISCO, December 28.—News is received to-day of the loss of the schooner Mary Swan, which went ashore at Santa Domingo, Lower California, some time ago. The steamer Alcatraz was sent down to bring her up, it having been learned that she had been got off; but before she could be taken in charge she had to be beached, and a storm coming up, she became a total wreck.

HAS GOTTEN THE SANTA FE. A Rumor That Strong Has Resigned the Presidency. BOSTON, December 28.—A rumor is circulated that W. B. Strong has resigned the presidency of the Atchison Company, to be succeeded by George H. Nettleton; Strong's private secretary states that Strong has no idea of resigning.

THE LATEST FROM OKLAHOMA. One Hundred Boomer Families With Teams. GAINESVILLE, Tex., December 28.—One hundred families with teams crossed the South Canadian river at Purcell, I. T., yesterday, entering the Oklahoma country to settle on claims near Purcell.

THE MONEY STUCK TO THE TAR ON HIS FINGERS. WASHINGTON, December 28.—H. C. C. Astwood, United States Consul at San Domingo, has been dismissed in disgrace. It is claimed that he failed to properly account for money which came into his possession.
