

SIXTY-FOUR ROUNDS.

The Long and Tedious McAuliffe-Myers Mill.

A BOXING MATCH, NOT A FIGHT.

It is Declared a Draw by the Referee.

Parson Davies' Judgment at Fault.

NORTH JUDSON, Ind., February 13.—The Chicago Times furnishes the following account of the great prize fight this morning at this point between Jack McAuliffe and Billy Myers for the lightweight championship of the world.

Prior to the fight a wrangle occurred over McAuliffe's having plastered his hands under his gloves. Finally he was allowed to put them on.

At 6:40 two marshals jumped on the platform and informed those present that the fight could not go on. After a long wrangle with the referee and the Sheriff, it was agreed to allow a boxing match.

Time was called at 6:58. First round—McAuliffe led, forced Billy to the ropes, and landed his left and right on his ribs. The round closed in favor of McAuliffe.

Second—There was an exchange of blows which Myers landed on his opponent's neck, getting in return a stinger on the nose. McAuliffe slipped at the ropes, saving himself from a terrible right-hand swing. A foul was claimed, but not allowed. The round ended with cautious sparring.

Third—Cautious sparring continued. McAuliffe led lightly, then landed heavily with his left, receiving a right. McAuliffe rushed and there was an even exchange, Billy getting a good right-hand blow full in McAuliffe's face which staggered him.

Fourth—Both men continued very cautious sparring for an opening. Not a blow was struck.

Fifth—Myers landed on McAuliffe's ribs with his right, and struck short again with his left.

Sixth—Again they moved cautiously, but one blow was struck, McAuliffe's right being cleverly stopped by Myers.

Seventh—McAuliffe landed lightly on Myers' mouth without return. McAuliffe washed Myers to the corner, a short arm exchange resulting.

Eighth—Opened with cautious sparring, the men being on the defensive, as usual. Myers led with his right, landing on McAuliffe's mouth, following it up with his left on Mac's nose without return.

Ninth—Myers led with his right and landed on Mac's arm. Cautious sparring followed. Mac got in a good right and left in Myers' face without return.

Tenth—Same opening and round; not a blow was struck.

Eleventh—McAuliffe rushed Myers; two short arm blows were exchanged and ended in a clinch.

Twelfth—Exchange of short arm blows, ending in a clinch. Mac again led with the left, receiving a stinger in the face. Myers landed lightly on his nose.

Thirteenth—Cautious sparring for over two minutes, when Mac led, receiving a sharp counter in the face.

Fourteenth—Mac rushed Myers, landing on his nose, and receiving two stinging blows on the face and neck. In rushing the second time Mac slipped and fell, Myers on top. Mac then commenced forcing matters.
