

NEWS NOTES.

The Central W. C. T. U. will hold its regular meeting tomorrow at 2:30 p. m. at the Temple.

Transfers of real estate yesterday amounted to \$78,541, and were 56 in number. Of these, 21 were for more than \$1,000 each, and 25 were for nominal considerations.

The First Nationalist Club will hold its semi-annual meeting for the election of officers and other business at 7:30 this evening in Temperance Temple.

The death of Allibone Morton at Garvanza is announced. Deceased was born in Ohio in 1830, and moved to Davenport, Iowa, in 1839, where he remained until 1883, when he came to Los Angeles, where he made a host of friends, who mourn his loss.

At 1:45 o'clock yesterday afternoon a canvas partition in the shop of A. A. Hunt, a tailor, at No. 348 South Spring street, became ignited from a stove which was used for heating flatirons, and flared up in a startling manner.

THE FIRE BOARD.

The Fire Commissioners met in regular session yesterday morning in the City Hall, Mayor Hazard presiding and Messrs. Keefe, Kuhrtz, Lovell and Moore present.

A communication from the Los Angeles Cable Railroad Company, thanking the board for the valuable services rendered by the department during the late storm, was received, read and placed on file.

The bill of Messrs. Orr & Sutich for \$87 for expenses entailed by the funeral of the late S. A. D. Springer was presented, and on motion was presented to the Chief for recommendation.

Chief Strohm reported that a vacancy had been caused by the death of S. A. D. Springer, driver of engine No. 7, and that he had temporarily appointed J. Springer, a brother of the deceased, to the position. Mr. Keefe nominated J. Springer for the vacancy; Mr. Lovell nominated W. L. Register, and W. S. Moore nominated W. J. Gardiner. On the matter being put to the vote, Messrs. Keefe and Kuhrtz voted for Springer, Messrs. Hazard and Lovell for Register, and Moore for Gardiner.

Mr. Muchmore, Inspector of Buildings, asked the board to appoint a committee to accompany him during his examination of the exits and entrances of the theaters, halls, hotels and other public buildings, and on motion of Mr. Moore the matter was referred to the board and Chief Engineer as a committee of the whole. The board then adjourned.
