LESS SPEED RECOMMENDED.

The Inquiry into Sunday's Fatal Cable Car Accident.

Employes Testify that Cars Should Go Rapidly Around the Curve.

The Jury Exonerate the Cable Company, but they Recommended a Much Slower Rate of Speed.

Coroner Cates held an inquest yesterday afternoon over the remains of Rev. James M. Jameson, who was killed last Sunday morning by a Downey-avenue car at the corner of Spring and First streets.

Ten jurors were selected as follows: J. W. Hoyt, A. J. Lenox, J. Scott, J. N. Cuthan, H. J. Hastings, J. C. Williams, C. E. Whelpley, C. A. Becker, J. D. Dunlap, W. H. McBean.

Several witnesses were examined, but the testimony was substantially as the facts previously printed, with the exception of the statements and opinions of some of the employes of the Pacific Railway Cable company.

The superintendent testified to the effect that the orders of the gripmen were to run the cars at the rate of speed at which they are run.

Another employe stated that a tight grip on the strands of the cable was necessary. If a slower speed was adopted, the loss to the company would be about \$2000 a year in consequence of the wear and tear of the machinery.

The jury rendered a verdict censuring no one, but made the following recommendation: "We recommend to the Pacific Railway company that they run their cars on the curve at the rate of speed not to exceed three miles an hour."
