Stock Exchange Review. New York, May 2.—The bears were again in control at the stock exchange today and succeeded in bringing about a further decline in prices over some of the closing figures of last night, chiefly in consequence of reports of buying orders from London, but a reaction set in and for a time great depression prevailed in the industrial group. In some instances the quotations were the lowest touched for many months. Tobacco broke 3/4, Iowa Central preferred 1/4, general electric 3/4, Manhattan 3/4, Dodge 3/4, Omaha 3/4, American Sugar 3/4, and others less amounts. During the afternoon a steady tone prevailed and although fluctuations were frequent, the tendency in the main was upward. The advance from the lowest was equal to 1/4 to 1/2 per cent. Government bonds closed steady.
