UP RUBIO CANYON.

THE FIRST EXCURSION OVER PASADENA'S MOUNTAIN RAILWAY.

Dr. Chichester's Bible Class Have a Most Enjoyable Trip Up the New Road—The Personnel of the Party.

Deep in the heart of the Sierra mountains an interesting event transpired yesterday. History was being enacted. The first excursion over the Pasadena Mountain railway landed a party of about 100 ladies and gentlemen at the beautiful pavilion in Rubio canyon, and the young people wandered at will up and down the romantic gorge, among its waterfalls, ferns, beehive crags, and indescribably wild and beautiful scenery. Everything was a surprise and a delight to the visitors—the substantial railway, the picturesque pavilion, the stupendous scenery and the steep railway incline, apparently ascending to heaven, like Jacob's ladder.

Prof. Love's railway is not yet open to the public. It has not even been formally inspected by the press. But the largest bible class in California, that belonging to Dr. Chichester's Presbyterian church in Los Angeles, determined to capture the situation for some lives, and manage some inexplicable way to pioneer their way ahead of all other excursions into those mysterious solitudes. Now a bible class which can accomplish such an enterprising feat must have a history of its own, and so it has, one well worth recording. It was the first Sunday in December last, that it numbered 71 young ladies. The class is thoroughly organized with the following efficient staff of officers: Dr. J. T. The party reached the power house at Mountain Junction at 9 a. m., whence they were transferred to cars which conveyed them into Rubio canyon. The trip was full of surprises. They found themselves penetrating literally into the heart of the mountain. Rounding one curve after another, the canyon became deeper and the granite declivities steeper, till finally the sky was a narrow path between a rim of cliffs.

At last the magnificent pavilion loomed in sight, firmly set on its pillars 60 feet above the singing brook below. From the southern veranda you look down upon the canyon, a vast expanse stretching across the cañon, and are surprised to learn that those are the tops of trees from 40 to 60 feet in height. From the northern veranda the great incline ascends to the summit of Echo mountain, 400 feet above the beholder, the steep ascent almost making one dizzy. The three rails forming the novel double track is blended into one as it approaches the top in the perspective 3000 feet distant.

Expressions of surprise, wonder and delight varied in every form that delighted and pleased humanity could invent were heaved on all sides.

At 4 o'clock the entire party assembled in the pavilion and happy speeches spiced with humor were made by Prof. James, Dr. Chichester, Dr. Price, Mr. Patterson and Prof. Love.

Dr. Chichester said that he had often tried the seashore and the mountains, but always found himself more refreshed in body and mind after a trip to the mountains. If he were a tourist he would try he should worship the mountains, for they strongly appealed to his sense of the grand and sublime in nature.

OUR PRODUCTS TOO HIGH.

A New Orleans Man On Southern California Features.

E. T. Tracy of New Orleans, arrived in this city yesterday from Fresno. He is staying at the Hollenbeck and has been travelling for several weeks with J. J. Morrison, of the New York Life.

Mr. Tracy is an extensive fruit grower in Southern Mississippi, and has recently been travelling over a great part of California inspecting the fruit ranches. He is very much taken with the Napa valley and also with the country immediately around Fresno.

"Taken altogether," said he, "I don't see there is so much difference in the production between your country here and that which lies along the Gulf of Mexico. California is only ahead of us in that they can raise oranges and lemons. We can raise the fruits, but there is always a danger of frost. We are way ahead of you in one matter, however, and that is in transportation facilities. I have the pick of five good railroads to ship by, and I can have my goods delivered in New York or Chicago on an average of 10 a day, and a freight charge being made for refrigerator ones either. I own 25,000 acres of land in lower Mississippi, about 60 miles from New Orleans, 400 acres of which are under cultivation. You would think the climate would be very warm down there during the hot months. It is not, however. The cool winds from the Gulf temper the atmosphere, and the thermometer never goes beyond 90 degrees.

I raise peaches, pears and table grapes, also some small fruits, but principally devote my attention to the former. Our fruit ripens about the same time as it does in California. There is little difference in that direction. I have been traveling since March 12th, and have seen much of interest in California.

It is a great country, but I must add that I'm satisfied with my own little farm in Southern Mississippi. The lack of railroads out here is a great drawback, and another thing which surprises me is the tendency of the people to boycott their own productions. Take wine for instance. I pay 60 cents a pint for claret at home. Out here I am compelled to pay the same figure for an equal article, and yet this state is the greatest wine producing one in the union. It seems strange that a pint of wine which costs 2 cents should be sold for 50 cents. A vineyardist in the Napa valley offered to lay me down wine in bulk at New Orleans 30 cents a gallon. I could sell it for 60 cents. I am thinking of taking his offer. I think it is a great mistake and hurts the country in the eyes of visitors to charge prices for the state's productions the same as they could be bought in the east. People come out here expecting to find wine, at least, cheap and they get badly fooled, especially at the hotels and restaurants."

Mr. Tracy goes to Pasadena tomorrow for a couple of days. He will remain in Los Angeles for a week or ten days.
