At the intersection of Michigan avenue and Pennsylvania avenue the grade shall be changed and established 86.00 on the north-east, and southwest corners and 85.50 at the northeast and southwest corners and 85.00 at the intersections of Pleasant avenue and Michigan avenue, and at the intersections of Michigan avenue and Kearney street and Pennsylvania avenue and Kearney street and Pennsylvania avenue the grade shall be established as follows:

And at all points between said designated points the grade shall be established as follows to conform to a straight line drawn between said designated points.

Eleventh and a half feet and above city datum plane.

Sec. 2.
