THE DOG WAS A THIEF.

HOW TWO MEN SUCCEEDED IN DEPRIVING A CANINE.

A Peculiar Case Before Justice Seaman—A Tale of a Dog and His Penchant for Chickens.

Trinidad Buerella, who the police claim has spent the greater part of an eventful existence in jail, was up for examination in Justice Seaman's court yesterday on a charge of felony.

Buerella, aided by an equally ingenious companion, one Juan Garcia, succeeded in educating a dog up to an extremely fine point of dishonesty.

Buerella and Garcia would take their walks abroad in the suburbs of the city where chickens roam in freedom untrammelled by restraining bars and fences.

The dog would meditatively follow them until the unsuspecting rooster appeared upon the scene. Then, at a word from his masters, he would silently pounce upon the fowl and before he had time to express his disapprobation of the proceedings the indignant bird would be safely stowed in a capacious sack which the Mexicans carried.

But all good things come to an end, and the ingenious thieves were found out and arrested. Garcia got 30 days in jail for saying that he put the chicken in his bag for safety from the dog, and there being several previous convictions against Buerella, a felony complaint was sworn out against him, and Justice Seaman held him yesterday to answer to the superior court.

Buerella made a statement, in which he did the weeping act, saying he knew he had done wrong, and he hoped the judge would punish him for it. Buerella's wish will in all probability be gratified.
