Rev. A. S. Clark Talks of Christ and John the Baptist.

The Discussion and Sermon at the Church of the New Era.

Mr. Bowman Gives a Discourse on the Immortality of the Soul.

Rev. A. S. Clark of Christ's Episcopal church, corner of Flower and Pico streets, preached before large congregations at both of yesterday's services.

His talk was a contrast of the life of John the Baptist and that of Jesus Christ. First as regarded by the Jews and then by the Lord himself.


