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THE CROPS. The Weather Bureau's Report of their Condition.

The local weather bureau furnishes the following report of the condition of the crops for the past week: Very warm weather prevailed in all the districts, culminating on Friday with a close, sultry condition of the atmosphere and a local rain of wide extent. Thunder storms occurred in the mountains with heavy rains in the San Jacinto range. Heavy local showers fell in the San Gabriel valley, causing slight damage to drying apricots, hay, and grain in the fields elsewhere. The rain was light and the damage immaterial.

The temperature ranged above the averages, the daily excess at Los Angeles being two degrees and at San Diego one degree. Grain threshing continues with a larger yield in some localities than expected; large shipments are being made though some grain is being stored in expectation of better prices.

The demoralized money market in the eastern states appears to have an effect upon the dried fruit trade; a Riverside exchange states that an order for two carloads of dried apricots, which were ready for shipment, was cancelled owing to the difficulty of getting money from the banks.

LOS ANGELES COUNTY. Lancaster—Harvest is in full blast. A steady rain fell for several hours Thursday afternoon in the center of the valley. On Friday it showered off and on all day, and was better distributed. There are no reports of serious damage.

VENTURA COUNTY. Hueneme—Close, hot weather prevailed, with lightning in the mountains. Nothing has impaired the fine condition of beans and corn. Hay is being baled, but there is no demand for it; threshing has begun.

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


