BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS

SOME IRREGULARITIES ABOUT THE BRIDGE-STREET PROTEST.

Changes in the Street Sweeping Program—Street Grading Matters—Various Recommendations.

The board of public works held a meeting yesterday, and transacted considerable business.

The protests against the improvement of Bridge street was the first business to come before the board. Some of the protesters appear to have signed for more property than they own, while the signatures of some non-owners were upon the protest.

The city engineer was ordered to make a survey and map of the property to be taken in the straightening of Lyon street, preparatory to its grading.

Wright & Leach asked that they be allowed to grade Ingraham street, from Wilmer street to Lucas avenue, by private contract.

The board recommended that the city engineer present the ordinance of intention to establish the grade, and when established the city attorney present the ordinance, allowing private contract according to specifications No. 5.

In the matter of the bid for the improvement of Solano avenue from the improved Santa Victoria street to the west line of Solano street, the board accepted the bid of F. A. McGrath for grading, at \$2 99 1/2 per lineal foot; sewer complete, \$67 each; flush tanks, \$109 each.


