There was great unanimity in the meeting, and there can be no doubt that within a short time the high schools of the county will be practically pursuing the same courses of study.

The result of this will be that pupils in high schools may be transferred from one district to another without loss of time, and without being obliged to change text books.

Nathan F. Smith of Santa Monica was elected secretary of the meeting, and will have charge of the correspondence necessary to complete the work begun yesterday.

Mr. Gray, in the Church of the Advent, has been most vigorous and successful in bringing the masses of the people into sympathy with the church, and in inspiring all who came under his influence to earnest work for the good of their fellow men.

The health of a member of his family, among other reasons, has led him to resign the rectorship of the Church of the Advent, and he has consented to take charge of St. Paul's, Los Angeles, for one year.

He will assume charge of the parish on the first Sunday of October.
