Cost of the Tax Roll in This and Other Counties. Why Does Government Cost More Here Than Elsewhere?

What the Auditors of Some Northern Counties Report as to Expenses. One Man Who Does all the Work Himself.

The Citizens' league has learned that County Auditor Lopez proposes charging more than 20 cents per average page for extending the tax roll, and believing that 10 cents a page on an average would be nearer the real value of the work, the league sent the following letter to a few counties in order to ascertain the cost of the work there:

GENERALS—Yours of the 12th inst. duly at hand, and I have filled in answers on blank, but suppose that they will be rather surprised at them, judging from an article I read in one of Oakland's papers giving the cost of your county government.

As county recorder I receive a salary of \$2200 and an auditor \$900, making \$3000 per annum. I am allowed one deputy at \$1200 and two copyists at \$900 each per annum.

I pay into the county treasury on an average of \$9000 per annum in fees.

We do not make duplicate assessment rolls, thereby saving that expense, and I have for the last five years computed the taxes all alone. Of course, we have always had a convenient rate for figuring.

I have mailed to you under another cover a page of the original and one of the delinquent roll. There are a couple of changes in them, but the principal part of them is there and can be readily understood.

You will observe that the first delinquency is on the original roll; therefore do not have the work of making out two delinquent rolls, but only the one, which is done the last of April, after the second installment becomes delinquent.

On the original roll the value of personal property and money is extended of itself, and all the real estate in one total; thereby making but two extensions for each name.

I also enclose one of our tax receipts. The ruling of the rolls, also the form of receipt, are my own get up, and as yet I have not seen a more convenient one.
