

Statement of the Development Work of the

Val Verde Gold Mines

And other Properties Belonging to the Randsburg Gold Mining, Milling and Water Supply Company.

Val Verde No. 1, Upper Incline Shaft.

The development of this property has been systematically carried on now for some months, under the most capable and efficient management, and now the mine shows an inexhaustible supply of the precious mineral. The main incline is situated at the top of Val Verde Hill, which showed after some preliminary development 3 1/2 feet of ore, averaging about \$12.00 per ton. A GERMAN CABINET SHAKE-UP

They will then go to Herringsdorf by the Baltic sea for the after cure. Until he finds suitable apartments Mr. White will stay at Kaiserhof. His reception by the princes and other members of the royal family has been deferred until the autumn. Mr. Cramp of the Philadelphia shipbuilding firm is now in Germany, engaged in investigating the recent progress made here in shipbuilding. An Alaskan Railway SEATTLE, Wash., June 19.—The British Columbia Development Association, one of the wealthiest corporations in the West, has completed arrangements for constructing 36 miles of railway to Central Alaska, for putting in a big saw-mill and for the establishment of a townsite at Skagaway Bay, Alaska. By this scheme it is proposed to turn all future immigration to the Yukon and Klondyke gold fields of Central Alaska from the route through Chilkoot Pass and St. Michaels to that over Skagaway Bay. The pass at this latter point is 2000 feet lower than Chilkoot Pass and is more accessible. A dozen men have thus far attempted to reach the gold fields by the pass at Skagaway Bay and found it comparatively easy of access and far superior to Chilkoot Pass. A Fraudulent Scheme BOSTON, June 19.—Clarence F. Jewett was arrested today as a fugitive from justice. Chief Inspector Watts says Jewett is wanted in Portland, Ore., for his connection with the affairs of the Eugene Orchard Homes company. This was a land scheme by which people of moderate means could secure homes on the installment plan. Jewett was an officer of the company, and he left Oregon two years ago. Jewett says the case has been settled, and he is no longer wanted. Some Mysterious Ones WAYCROSS, Ga., June 19.—Dr. J. A. Spence of Waycross, Ga., has in his office a skeleton of a man found Wednesday in Mosquito bay, three miles from Waycross. The skull contains four bullet holes, in the back behind the right ear. The skeleton may be that of C. A. Cappel, who mysteriously disappeared last August, after having collected a large amount of money at Blakely. Chinese Riots SHANGHAI, June 19.—Foreign riots have broken out in the province of Kian Si. The English mission at Wu Chen has been destroyed, and the refugees have fled to Kin Kiang. The Catholic mission was saved by the intervention of troops. Ran in the Rain LONDON, June 19.—F. E. Bacon, the English champion long-distance runner, today ran against the one-hour record of 11 miles, 970 yards, which he succeeded in breaking, covering 11 miles, 1234 yards. This was a steady downpour of rain throughout the race.
