The Awful Record of the Cold Storage Warehouse Fire at Pittsburg on Wednesday

PITTSBURG, Feb. 10.—Eleven people dead, twenty-seven missing, eighteen injured and property loss of \$1,500,000 is the awful record of the big fire of last night.

SEARCH FOR BODIES
All day long firemen, policemen and other city employes have been working at the risk of their lives, but up to night-fall but little progress has been made in clearing away the debris.

ESTIMATES OF LOSS
It is difficult to get figures, but insurance experts say that it will be at least \$1,500,000, and may be more.
