PROFESSOR BERNARD MOSES ON "NEGLECTED HISTORY"

DR. JORDAN ON THE FUR SEAL

Closing Session to Be Held in the First Congregational Church This Morning

Hasard's pavilion was a sea of faces yesterday morning, when the second day's session of the Southern California Teachers' association opened.

"When the United States in 1868 bought the land of the great north," said the speaker, "they found there two little dots of islands that are more important than all the rest of Alaska."
