

CRUZADOS WINS THE HANDICAP

SCORES AN EASY VICTORY AT TWELVE TO ONE

E. J. Baldwin's Horse Runs Through Six Furlongs in the Mud in the Fast Time of 1:14 1-4.

Racing Improving By Forest Lowry

The run of prosperity at Ascot appears to continue unbroken, and there seems to be no longer any doubt that the present is destined to be the most successful in the history of racing on the Pacific coast.

The attendance has been exceptionally large of late, and altogether the management of the Los Angeles Jockey club has reasons to congratulate itself of having entered upon a career of unexampled prosperity.

The Mount Lowe Handicap, at six furlongs, with \$1000 added, was the feature event yesterday. The affair drew out a field of seven two-year-olds and upward.

With the rise of the barrier the race assumed its one-horse affair. E. J. Baldwin's Cruzados, the extreme outsider at 12 to 1, shot to the front early and was never headed.

James Blute's Sals was the best backed of the five that went to the post in the fourth race, a free handicap for 2-year-olds and upward, over a mile and a sixteenth of ground.

Among the ten starters for the one-mile selling race first on the card, Ethel Scruggs, the post favorite, finally asserted herself, and, after getting away none too well, came on at the end and won by half a length from Eleven Bells, who in turn just did last long enough to beat Fogy Grandpa a head for the place.

Andrew Mack was the good thing turned loose in the second race. He was heavily played at 5 to 2 and rewarded his backers by winning the event by five open lengths.

Cerro Santa met with no interference yesterday and won the fifth race on the card easily from West Brookfield and The Major.

J. A. Wernberg's Dutiful again returned to life and ran a smashing good race. The gray colt won the closing event at one mile through the superior riding of Tooman.

With an even break Ray could not have lost the first race. H. Smith, who had the mount, was asleep when the barrier was released and as a result his mount was badly messed about.

Andrew Mack showed a wonderful reversal of form. In his last race he was twenty lengths behind the winner in about the same kind of company that he beat yesterday by five lengths easily.

Tab Diamante. He was given an easy ride when the boy saw he was beaten. Cruzados was the medium of a big killing yesterday.

Prince Brutus Only Favorite to Win. Vigoroso, at 20 to 1, Took Third Race in Driving Finish.

Nigrette ruled the favorite in the handicap at seven furlongs, but was never a keen contender. Venator took the lead on the far turn and won easily at the end from Judge.

Vigoroso, who took the third race, was at the lucrative odds of 20 to 1. He just lasted long enough to beat Young Marlow, who was slated for a killing by a few of those on the inside.

Prince Brutus has recovered his best form and ran away from his field in the last race. When right he is one of the best young horses in training.

Eddie Dominick leaves tomorrow for New Orleans, where he goes to ride for Sam Hildreth. There were twenty-seven books doing business in the betting ring today.

CORRIGAN IN CONTROL OF THREE RACE TRACKS

Edward is Now One of the Strongest Leaders of Racing in the West. By Associated Press. CHICAGO, Dec. 31.—Edward Corrigan has secured control of the Hawthorne race track. The deal was closed tonight when Richard Fitzgerald, who for a long time has been the principal stockholder in the track, sold out his interests to Corrigan.

The change of ownership means, it is said, that the Western Jockey club will have a fight on its hands if some action is not taken at its regular monthly meeting on January 3 to revise the racing dates for 1935, picked out for the different tracks throughout the west and south at the annual meeting early in December.

Corrigan now has full control of the new track at New Orleans and the probabilities are that he will also get control of the Kansas City track. The control of these two tracks, together with Hawthorne, makes Corrigan one of the strongest leaders of racing in the west. Allied with Corrigan will be found several of the other smaller tracks of the west and southwest, including Essex park at Hot Springs, Ark.
