

PRESIDENT MAKES BID FOR HARMONY

INVITES CONGRESSMEN TO A CONFERENCE TODAY

Will Consider Condition of Treasury Situation as to Appropriations and Need for Revenue Legislation

WASHINGTON, Jan. 6.—President Roosevelt has invited a number of Republican senators and representatives to a conference at the White House tomorrow afternoon.

An effort will be made at the conference to harmonize differences which have arisen among the Republicans as to the nature of the legislation to be enacted at the present session and to secure, if possible, unanimity of action regarding legislative action in the future.
