

MORGAN BUYS CHINA RAILROAD

FINANCIER BUYS INTERESTS OF KING LEOPOLD

Great System Will Be Formed by Combination of French, Belgian and American Interests. Chinese Opposed

By Associated Press. PARIS, Jan. 14.—Information from Brussels reaching the highest quarters here shows it is the extensive interest of King Leopold in the Canton-Hankow railroad which have passed into the hands of representatives of J. Pierpont Morgan of New York.

That portion of the project relating to Pekin and Hankow is still in abeyance, but the French view appears favorable to combining the interests so as to make a continuous route from the capital to the great emporium in the south.

Reports received from China show there is much native agitation against foreign railroad enterprises and the authorities here fear this may interfere with the proper development of French, Belgian and American interests.



MONKS REVIVE MEDIEVAL PLAYS

ANCIENT CUSTOM TAKEN UP IN GERMANY

Series of Tableaux and Pantomimes Reproduced by Benedictine Fathers at Maria Laach Monastery

Special Cable to The Herald. BERLIN, Jan. 14.—An interesting attempt has been made at the famous Benedictine monastery of Maria Laach to revive the medieval mystery plays. The magnificent church was crowded with sightseers. The altar was screened by a thick curtain, which was drawn when the abbot and the confraternity took their seats in the choir. Thereupon a host of angels, all clad in white, appeared, among them being the Archangel Michael and Lucifer.

Suddenly the altar was illuminated, and the manger at Bethlehem was disclosed. Michael and the good angels kneel in adoration, but Lucifer turns his back in contempt. As he does so his white robe falls to the ground and he is revealed in all his blackness. He is then driven away, and Michael takes Lucifer's white robe and presents it before the altar. The second scene represents the temptation of Adam by the serpent. Lucifer again appears, bearing the serpent all decked with flowers, which fall from his scaly length. After Adam has succumbed to temptation there are representations of the Tree of Life and Tree of Knowledge. While this scene is being enacted before the altar the choir sings words in Latin illustrating the proceedings. After these preliminary scenes the actual mystery begins. From the Old Testament various living pictures are presented, supposed to bear on events

which are fulfilled in the New Testament.

There is, for example, the burning bush, typical of the light to lighten the Gentiles; there is Elisha at Jericho, sweetening the waters of Jordan from a vessel of salt; the rebuilding of the temple, etc. The final portion of the mystery play is occupied with the fulfillment of the promise of the old covenant. A young priest is seen at the altar who represents the Bride of Heaven. To him the angels do obeisance, while the choir breaks out into the strains of the Magnificat and various hymns in honor of the Virgin. A procession is then formed and the vast congregation sink on its knees as the abbot and his monks carry an elaborately decorated image of the Virgin to the altar. The abbot's benediction closes this singular revival of an old medieval custom, which is said to have had a profound emotional influence on those who witnessed it.

NIECE OF M'KINLEY WEDS

Widow of Late George F. Morse Marries San Francisco Man. Special to The Herald. NEW YORK, Jan. 14.—Mrs. Ida McKinley Morse, widow of the late George F. Morse, clerk of the United States court of the District of California, was married to Harry Rowell Cooper of San Francisco at the Church of the Transfiguration today by Rev. Dr. George C. Houghton. They were attended by the bride's daughter, Miss Marjorie Morse and Colonel Kowalsky, the Belgian representative in New York for the Congo Free State. Mrs. Cooper is a niece of the late President McKinley and a daughter of the late David McKinley, former American consul at Honolulu.

Jefferson Poteet, the Chicagoan, who claims to have been held up at or near the corner of First and South Hill streets Friday night, left the receiving hospital yesterday afternoon. As he passed out he told the newspaper men that he was held up, reiterating the statements made the night before. Despite this fact the officers do not accept the hold-up theory. Chief Hammel yesterday interviewed three young men who say they saw Poteet when he stumbled and fell and that he was drunk, or staggering like a drunken man, when he tumbled head foremost into the street. The detectives do not believe Poteet was held up and robbed, as he reported, and say that Poteet himself even admits he was muddled and might be mistaken. The case will not be investigated further.

FORMER CITY AUDITOR DEAD

Fred H. Teale Dies in Fallon, Nevada

Fred H. Teale, formerly of Los Angeles, died last Thursday at Fallon, Nevada. Mrs. Teale, who is now in Los Angeles, received the first news of her husband's death yesterday. She got no details in the meager telegram which was sent her. Mr. Teale's body will be brought to this city for interment. Teale was prominent in politics in Los Angeles, twice holding the office of city auditor.

SAYS "PUP" IS BIG DOG

C. Q. Egbert Severely Injured by a Canine. C. Q. Egbert, who lives on the corner of Temple and Buena Vista streets and who obtained judgment against a neighbor on account of a wound inflicted by the latter's dog, asserts the beast was not a mere pup as has been said. According to the wounded man the dog is about 8 feet over all, or from tip to tip and weighs about 140 pounds. The "pup" is also four years old, according to Mr. Egbert. Egbert is six feet in height, but he

says when the dog attacked him it stood on its hind feet, placed its fore paws on his shoulders and made a savage snap at his neck. In order to save his neck Egbert thrust his hand forward and the powerful jaws closed over it, driving the teeth through.
