CREAMERY BUTTER MILK A BIG LEAP

QUOTATIONS ARE INCREASED 7 1-2 CENTS A ROLL

Article Scarce and Receipts Below Normal Trade Requirements. Eggs Are Dropped One Cent. Potatoes Go Up

An unusually active and firm butter market prevails in Los Angeles, while receipts have been large all week the surplus is not in evidence, as stocks are cleaned up for creamery from day to day. The tone of the butter market has been aided by the shipment eastward of about ten carloads of butter from storage. This has aided in clearing the situation of a menace and leaves the market in an excellent condition to meet the usual spring rush of butter.

Based on these conditions and the general outlook the butter board of trade on Saturday afternoon advanced creamery butter 7 1/2 cents a roll, or 3 1/2 cents a pound. This makes creamery 6 1/2 cents a roll and becomes operative later. The jump is from 60 cents a roll. In order to arrive at this conclusion a caucus of leading members of the butter board was held Friday afternoon and the situation fully discussed.

EGGS LOWERED—On the produce exchange Saturday the egg quotation committee fixed the selling price of ranch eggs at 31 cents. This is a decline of another cent, and dealers who care to express an opinion say that more declines must follow to meet market conditions. Demand is fairly satisfactory in face of larger receipts.

POTATOES JUMPING—In keeping with the statements made in this review each day, the potato market at the close of the week showed greater firmness. This came Saturday afternoon when brokers announced that an advance in Highlands had occurred of 10 cents per 100, making the lay down cost \$1.10. This advance being on Highlands, that are so plentiful, indicates plainly that all varieties will strengthen as the season advances. Fancy potatoes are scarce and are held very firm.

Another carload of onions was received to be added to the large holdings. The market is about steady, but as soon as the big supply centers are more depleted local dealers say they anticipate an advance. This will come in fancy as they are now obtained by sorting, the fair to common are plentiful.

VEGETABLES AND TRUCK.—The vegetable market has improved and offerings are larger, as the recent rains helped the growing. Lower prices are expected this week. Fresh peas closed at 36 1/2 cents a pound, string beans 56 1/2 cents. Tomatoes are lower at \$1.00/1.20 a case and 50 1/2c in boxes.

One carload of cabbage arrived Saturday and jobbed \$1.00/1.25 a sack. Egg plant rules 56 1/2 cents; chili peppers 46 1/2 cents and mangoes at 6 cents. Lettuce has dropped to 65/90 cents a sack on quality.

All small fish were scarce, rock cod and halibut was plentiful and the first barracuda of the season came in. No lobster came in; crabs were cleaned up and wanted.

Rabbits were gone at the close of business Saturday and the few geese and ducks arriving found an open market.

FRUITS ARE FIRM.—Apples now lead in point of interest with the Julian crop that is in storage reported active. Of these there are many varieties and they range from \$1.35/1.75 a box. New York apples in barrels run from \$4.50/4.65 a barrel, equaling about \$1.50/1.60 a box.

Grape fruit is weaker and drags from \$1.00/1.50 a box on quality, the choice Padre reaching \$2.00. Lemons that are fancy reach \$1.75/2.00 a box.

Fancy naval oranges of well known brands command \$1.75/2.00 a box. The Oatman fancy packages are popular at 50 cents, jobbing, and 65 cents at retail.
